### PASTOR'S CORNER

The hit on liturgical music/worship is that there is no depth of emotion, it doesn't lift the spirit, the emotion. Ya, well there's a technical term, that's "bupkus" or as Charles Dickens wrote, "bah humbug".

The truth of the matter is that it most certainly does! The problem is that the past few generations are so superficial, so motivated by "eros" love, that it's all about me, give me, give me. Liturgical worship is much deeper, it gives to God who gives back to me. Yea, well we want to cut out the middle-man and, as always, gimme, gimme. If we would really stop and listen we might realize how much more comforting and strengthening liturgy is, how it reaches down to your soul, because it's the Holy Spirit who is reaching. We can stay with the shallow/superficial or we can really build that relationship with God the way that man has been doing it, which would date back to at least the time of King David, King Solomon and Solomon's Temple.

Now, I will concede this. Because liturgical worship is difficult, and for those who lead worship and really don't get it, they will do a lousy job. Sure there are many young pastors who can do it, but they really don't get it and after awhile it does seem to be going through the motions. For me, who is much less talented, but who has gotten it and is better able to articulate it, but still no talent, you know what, have a little patience with me and my lack of talent won't matter. What will matter is the depth of emotion and love that we convey to the Father in the liturgy. If you just go through the motions meaning will not come out and again, there are too many who should do it well, but just don't get it. Sorry, but seems there are far too many of the following mindsets: "Here I am going through the motions, I don't really know what I'm doing or how I'm doing it or why and, frankly, don't really care. Right, wrong or indifferent and, frankly, I don't even think there's a "right"."

Well yea, there is a "right" and let's talk about it.

I have opined before, that the difference between "happy-clappy" and real worship is the emotional content. God the Holy Spirit has finally helped me to articulate the case for the liturgy much better.

Liturgical worship is about agape love. I give to You (God), I lift You up, I know it's all about You (Father, Son and Holy Spirit). It's only through You and because of You that I even exist, no less have any meaning at all. It is all about You, when I acknowledge that and praise You, You make it all about me. You make me something I could never be, Your child! You give me something that I could never get - everlasting eternal life in the resurrection. Real worship is always about completing that connection. Not me just sitting back and just taking, again that adolescent attitude.

# STEWARDSHIP: FEBRUARY 2018

"I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:8-9).

11

Without commands or even arm-twisting, St. Paul encourages, even challenges, the Church in Corinth to demonstrate the sincerity of their faith by their generosity in giving. He does this because giving generously is a gift of the Spirit given to us through the Gospel.

St. Paul wrote: "But just as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us—see that you also excel in this grace of giving" (2 Corinthians 8:7). In other words, just as we grow in faith and speech and knowledge of eternal things by the Holy Spirit through the Word of God, so also do we grow in giving from the same Spirit through the same Word.

The problem is that the grace of generosity often grows cold in us. It's not so much that we stop giving, but we don't put it first. We treat it like all the other bills that must be paid. It becomes a chore, just one more thing to check off a list of things to do. That empties it of its spiritual power and robs us of the joy that Christ and the Scriptures assign to it.

On top of that, since this generosity is linked to faith and knowledge of divine things, a lack of excelling in giving is a sure sign that our faith and knowledge of God are under attack as well.

Thus St. Paul points to the foundation of generosity: the generosity of Christ Himself. Even though He was rich, He became poor so that we who are poor might become rich. Thus, the incarnation, suffering, and death of our Lord on the cross is the reason, source, and driving force for our generosity in giving to the church.

And since Christ who was rich became poor so that we might be rich in His grace—of which generous giving is part—so we also who are rich in His grace can excel in pressing His grace into service toward the gracious work of the church.

Pay attention to what you give to the church so that you may excel at it. And if you find that your heart has grown cold or indifferent toward it, immerse yourself in God's Word. Read it at home. Attend Bible Class, Hear and listen to it preached in the Divine Service.

Be reminded of what Christ has done for you in His incarnation, suffering, and death. For this will strengthen your faith and knowledge. And where that excels, so will the grace of giving excel also.



# ESQUINA DEL PASTOR-FEBRUARY 2018

El hit de la música litúrgica/el culto es que no hay profundidad de emoción, no levantar el ánimo, la emoción. Ya, también, hay un término técnico, que es "bupkus" o como Charles Dickens escribió, "bah humbug".



La verdad del asunto es que seguramente no! El problema es que las últimas generaciones son tan superficiales, tan motivados por "eros", el amor, que es todo acerca de mí, dame, dame. El culto litúrgico es mucho más profunda, da a Dios que da la espalda a mí. Sí, bien queremos recortar el middle-man y, como siempre, dame, dame. Si queremos detener realmente y escuchar podríamos comprender cuánto más reconfortante y el fortalecimiento de la liturgia es, cómo llega a tu alma, porque es el Espíritu Santo quien está alcanzando. Podemos quedarnos con lo superficial/superficial o realmente podemos construir esa relación con Dios el camino que el hombre ha estado haciendo, que se remontan al menos a la época del rey David, el rey Salomón y el Templo de Salomón.

Ahora, debo admitir esto. Porque el culto litúrgico es difícil, y para quienes llevan el culto y realmente no lo consigue, lo hará un pésimo trabajo. Seguro que hay muchos jóvenes pastores que pueden hacerlo, pero realmente no lo consigue y después de un rato parece que se va a través de las mociones. Para mí, que es mucho menos talento, pero que ha llegado y es más capaz de articular, pero todavía ningún talento, sabes qué, tener un poco de paciencia conmigo y mi falta de talento no importa. Lo que importa es la profundidad de la emoción y el amor que transmitimos al Padre en la liturgia. Si usted sólo tiene que ir a través de las mociones significado no saldrá y nuevamente, hay demasiadas quién debe hacerlo bien, pero no lo consigue. Lo sentimos, pero parece que hay demasiados de pensar lo siguiente: "Aquí estoy repasando los movimientos, realmente no sé lo que estoy haciendo o cómo lo estoy haciendo o por qué y, francamente, no importa. A la derecha, mal o indiferente y, francamente, no pienso que existe un "derecho".

Y sí, hay un "derecho" y hablemos de ello.

He opinado antes, que la diferencia entre "happy clappy" y el verdadero culto es el contenido emocional. Dios el Espíritu Santo ha finalmente me ayudó a articular el caso para la liturgia, mucho mejor.

El culto litúrgico es sobre el amor ágape. Te doy (Dios), me levante, sé que es todo acerca de ti (Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo). Es sólo a través de ustedes y debido a que yo aún existe, no menos tienen algún significado. Es todo acerca de usted, cuando reconozco que alabar y usted, hacer que todo acerca de mí. Ustedes me hacen algo que yo nunca podría ser su hijo! Usted darme algo que yo nunca podría conseguir - vida eterna en la resurrección. La adoración verdadera es siempre acerca de la finalización de esa conexión. No me sentarte y acaba teniendo, más que la actitud de los adolescentes.






