YOUR CHURCH GARDEN

First, plant five rows of peas: presence, promptness, preparation, purity, and perseverance.

Next to these plant three rows of squash: squash gossip, squash criticism, squash indifference.

Then plant five rows of lettuce: let us be faithful to God, let us be loyal and unselfish, let us be true to our obligations, let us obey our Lord's mandates, and let us love one another.

No garden is complete, of course, without turnips: turn up for meetings, turn up with a smile, turn up with new ideas, and turn up with determination to make everything count for something worthwhile and God-pleasing.

As you can see, there are many worthwhile suggestions in what my aunt shared with me. I would like to add that we remember to put God first in all we do and to pray for guidance.

I remember what was shared from the pulpit recently. The proclaimer of the word for the day quoted a verse from the hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." Verse two of the hymn was the quotation: "With might of ours can naught be done, Soon were our loss effected; But for us fights the valiant One, Whom God Himself elected. Ask ye, Who is this? Jesus Christ it is, Of Sabaoth Lord, And there's none other God; He holds the field forever."

OPEN LETTER TO ALL FIRST ST. JOHN'S MEMBERS

Joyce and Gordon Moul have announced that they will retire from radio on or about September 28th or 29th. 2018. The radio station will have reached three years of continuous operation under the same ownership. This milestone will open new possibilities for the future of WYCO LP. under the terms of its' license. It has been an honor and privilege to work for F.S.J. as your leaders of the all-volunteer radio station and great group of volunteers

From the first thought that a new radio station could be built in York, the plan "A" was to join hands with our sister congregations in a common cause of spreading Jesus's Gospel and that the radio station would be common ground for all LCMS members. Plan "A" has been our hope for the past 5 years, but this hasn't happened.

When we leave we have plan "B" to place the license in the stewardship of the members of F.S.J. and go off the air. The license can be held safely for up to a year while remaining off the air, and this time may allow for re-organization as the license and all systems and equipment are to be secured so if anyone wants to restore the Gospel to 106.1 it will be possible to return to the air.

THE FUTURE OF FIRST ST. JOHN'S COMMITTEE FOUND AN ARTICLE ON LINE INCLUDED ARE 6 POINTS FOR A CHURCH IN

TRANSITION. The Article was written by Pastor Ben Simpson.

the church has moved into a time of transition. If your church is in this scenario, I simply want to hearten you with six biblical truths.

1. God will be with this church at all times.

You are not forsaken. God is with your congregation. "I will never leave your or forsake you," (Heb 13:5). Pastors will come and go. Only God will never leave us. And the presence of God is more vital to the life of the church.

2. God is in control.

God "works all things according to the counsel of His will" (Eph. 1:11). Do you believe that? This pastoral transition is not happening outside of the will of God. God is working this according to the counsel of his will. So the question is not, "Who is in control?" God is in control. The question is, "Will you rest in him by trusting him?"

3. God plans good out of this transition.

It might not feel good right now, but God has promised that he works all things together for the good of his people (Rom 8:28). Is your church part of his people? If so, this transition is included in "all things"? Therefore, you can rest assured that good will come from it. That's how awesome God is: even those things that don't feel good are used for good. It might not be the good you have in mind, but it is good. Therefore, walk forward in faith.

4. It's okay to weep.

While good will come out this pastoral transition, that doesn't remove the deep sadness. Losing your pastor hurts. I'm reminded of how the Ephesian elders wept at Paul's goodbye: "And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all. And there was much weeping on the part of all; they embraced Paul and kissed him, being sorrowful most of all because of the word he had spoken, that they would not see his face again. And they accompanied him to the ship" (Acts 20:36-38).

I believe the Ephesians knew that God would be with them, that he was in control, and that he was going to bring good out of this transition. Nevertheless, they wept. And it's okay to weep. It's actually a way of saying thank you to both God and your pastor.

5. Ministry must go on.

Notice what the Great Commission does not say, "Go therefore and make disciples . . . if you have a pastor."

One church that I used to work with lost their pastor. When I'd call their lay leaders about a ministry opportunity, their answer was always, "Well, you see, we just don't have a pastor right now." They had forgotten that ministry must continue in the interim. The Great Commission doesn't include any conditionals.

Does ministry become a bit harder without a pastor leading? Probably so, but if he was a good pastor, he will have obeyed Ephesians 4:11-12 by equipping the saints for the work of the ministry. In the interim, you and the lay leadership of the church must make sure ministry continues. Get to work!

6. The church must not scatter.

Jesus promised the flock would scatter at his crucifixion (Mat 26:31). For a season, that's exactly what happened. The same often happens in churches during pastoral transition. Because "their" pastor is no longer there or ministry begins to lag, folks trickle out. Some reasons for going might be legitimate, but this may also be the time in which the congregation should most strongly gather together for support and encouragement. Recognize the temptation to scatter and work more diligently to stay bound together in unity and love. This will be a season of testing for you. I know you didn't ask for it, but with God's help, you'll endure it. For churches currently in this situation: May the interim bring blessings you never expected, and I pray that God provides a new pastor for your church soon.

"For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery" (Gal. 5:1).

We celebrate this month because of the freedoms and liberties our country has afforded us. We are right to do this. We should be thankful for these liberties: the freedom to gather together to worship and to live out what we believe in our daily lives.

But freedom and liberty in our age has devolved. It has become a freedom from duty instead of a freedom for it. Indeed, freedom and liberty in our age has turned into licentiousness: a license to do what we want, when we want.

This license is a submission, again, to a voke of slavery. For freedom as license to do what we desire when we desire it means we are slaves to our desires, slaves to our passions.

Christ died to set us free from our sinful desires. In Holy Baptism, our Old Adam is drowned and put to death along with all sin and evil desires so that a new man may arise and live before God in righteousness and purity.

In Christ, we are a new creation. We are set free from the passions of the flesh so that we are free to do our duty and bear fruits of the Spirit.

Our duty is what God calls us to do as members of a family, society, and the church.

God calls us to believe in His Word and gladly hear and learn it. He calls us to pray for all people. He calls us to live in faith toward Him and in fervent love for our neighbor. He calls us to put the gifts He gives to us in His service. God calls parents to provide for their children and raise them in the fear and admonition of the Lord. And God calls children to honor their parents and provide and care for them when they are no longer able to do so themselves.

God calls the government to punish those who do evil and to reward those who do good. He calls citizens to pay their taxes and honor the governing officials as God's servants. He calls pastors to preach and teach the Gospel as well as repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And He calls hearers to support those who teach them with every good thing.

Christ died to set us free from the works of our selfish flesh, giving us the freedom and liberty to do our duty. Stand firm, then, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.
