



**FOR MARCH NEWSLETTER** 

- 1. Move the eternal light to the side of the Altar as approved by Church Council.
- 2. Install inside light to shine on Rose window (need approval from Church Council).
- 3. Repair and paint (or epoxy) the old boiler room floor.
- 4. Install the new janitor sink and shutoff controls.
- 5. Purchase and install window well covers for front and side of Parish Hall.
- 6. Reinstall and close in the water heater in basement kitchen.
- 7. Discuss replacing kitchen sink(s) and refrigerator.
- 8. Repair deteriorated plaster around windows in Parish Hall basement.
- 9. Remove unneeded items in Parish Hall basement and clean floor and stairs.
- 10. Remove all non church items on second floor of Parish Hall and reorganize records.
- 11. Discuss options to repair and renew the outside church entrance steps.
- 12. Install new floating floor (with trap door) in storage room next to the Altar.
- 13. New digital timing controls installed for the cross and the church front door lights.

## VICAR REPORT FEBRUARY 2023

The Winter semester on "The Books of Moses: The Beginning and The New Beginning." concludes this Friday.

Pastor C. and I continue to connect on Thursday mornings to reflect on the current coursework, and we share in a devotional group every other Thursday at 6:30 am.

The next Winkel meeting is tentatively planned for March to be held at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Parkton, Md.

The Lenten rotation is set with Pastors Banach and Cosgrove. We will use the Lenten Series from Creative Communications called "Amazing Grace." It focuses on well-known people from the Bible who experienced God's amazing grace in their lives.

I'll be at St. John on March 2<sup>nd</sup> to lead devotions at the compassion center.

SED President Harmon will be at Redeemer Lutheran Church n Parkton, MD, for a meet and greet on Tuesday, March 6<sup>th,</sup> from 2-4:30 pm. A PowerPoint presentation will also be made, and all are invited. If you plan to attend, let me know by this Sunday so that Redeemer can determine the amount of refreshments they will need.

We are at the beginning of Lent. During the Lenten season, the church calls to our attention the sufficiency of what God gives. It points to the sufficiency of God's grace in the atoning work of Jesus. It shows us the sufficiency of faith in Jesus' work for us. It makes known the sufficiency of God's Word in faith and life.

But Lent doesn't just remind us of the sufficiency of God's spiritual gifts — the gifts that pertain to our redemption and salvation. Lent also reminds us of the sufficiency of the physical, temporal gifts of God which pertain to this body and life. In other words, it reminds us of the importance of godly contentment and of outward discipline and training of the body.

This outward training of the body teaches us not to give in to every desire of our flesh, but to learn to say no to them. And it does this in such a way that if you fail, it is no sin. It is a way to practice without putting yourself into a compromising situation.

Fasting is a good example of this outward training. When you fast, you are practicing saying no to the desires of your body. But if you fail in this, if you break your fast, you have not sinned. But you have learned something about how your flesh works, how difficult it is to fight against it, and how you need help from above to discipline the desires of your body.

Another example is almsgiving. An increase in giving to the church and its mission during Lent is also a form of outward training. We all know that our flesh finds security in money and stuff. By committing to give more to the church, you are training your flesh. You are, by this outward discipline, training yourself to be content with what God gives. You are practicing saying "no" to your desires. Again, if you fail, you have not sinned. But you've learned just how powerful your flesh is — it leads you instead of you leading it. You've learned how you need help from above in being content with what God gives.

This is why St. Paul instructs young Pastor Timothy in this way:

But godliness with contentment is great gain, for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs. (1 Tim. 6:6–10)

Our sufficiency is not of ourselves; it is in God. Let us learn this without sin by training our flesh this Lenten season.

We are in the midst of the Lenten season. It is a good time to reflect on our own sinful lives as we hear this year of the people from scripture who were shown God's "Amazing Grace."

The Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday and continues through Good Friday.

The five Wednesdays in March will begin with a meal at 6:00 pm followed by the service at 7:00 pm as was stated last month in the newsletter and in the tri-fold. Choir rehearsal will begin after the service on those Wednesdays.

As stated above, we will be hearing about people from the Bible that were shown God's "Amazing Grace." The sermons are delivered by two people. One is the pastor, who is like a narrator and proclaimer. The other person reads the part of the person from the Bible that the sermon is about. I am looking for people to read those parts. If you are interested, please contact me and I will see that you get a copy of the sermon ahead of time.

In Holy Week, (Palm Sunday through Good Friday), nothing except choir takes place on Wednesday. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday the service is at 7:00 pm.

Maundy Thursday is a communion service with the stripping of the altar at the end of the service. This prepares the worship space for the bleak starkness of Good Friday.

Good Friday will be a Tenebrae (service of darkness) service with the choir helping to lead worship. Because the church will gradually get darker throughout the service, you might consider bringing a small flashlight as the congregation will be singing throughout the service.
